**PORT PHILLIP FERRIES – WAKE WASH MEASUREMENT TRIALS**

**Date:** 24 February 2020

**Refers:** 312 (T) - 2019

**Details:** Port users are advised that the Port Phillip Ferries (PPF) operated *Geelong Flyer*, will conduct a series of trial runs between the Westgate Bridge and Swanson Dock Swing Basin for wake wash measurements on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> Feb 2020 from 1300 to 1700. The runs will be conducted at speeds between 6 and 15 knots and in various transit lanes details in the graphic below. The trials will be conducted around commercial vessel movements.

During the wake wash measurement run, the *Geelong Flyer* will be exempted from the speed limit of 6 knots when operating on the waters of the Yarra River between the southern dripline of the West Gate Bridge and the Western drip line of the Bolte Bridge.

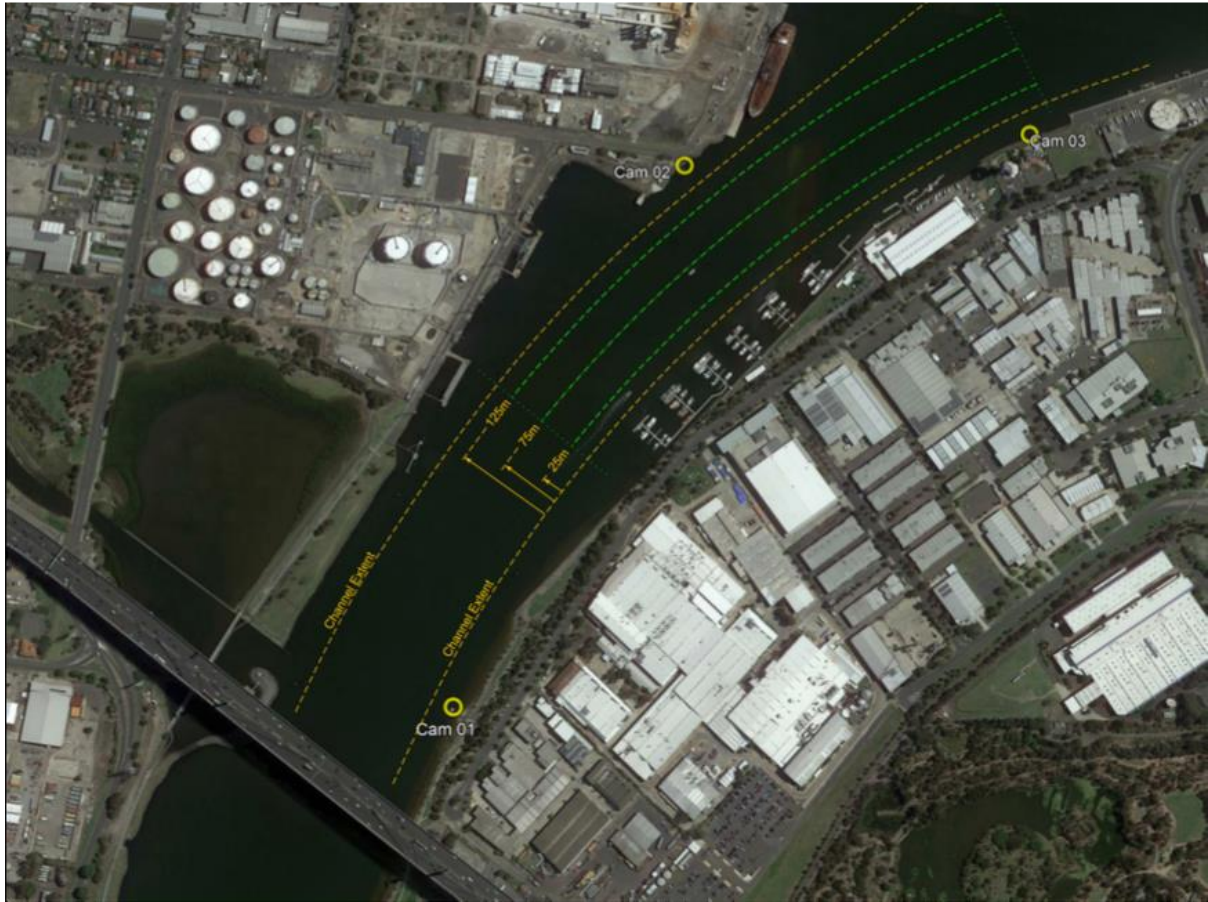
