**MARIBYRNONG RIVER - WESTGATE TUNNEL PROJECT CONSTRUCTION WORKS
EXTENDED**

Date: 01 August 2020

Refers: **NtM 176 (T) – 2019 and is here by cancelled.**

Details: Port users are advised that construction works going on at Maribyrnong River to the North of Maribyrnong Berth extending to Shepherd Bridge, is now extended till approximately end Dec 2020. Works will be conducted Monday to Saturday during daylight hours. The works will include piling and construction of three bridges crossing the river.

Piling works will commence on the western side of the river and progress to the north. The construction zone will be delineated with fence boom and yellow special markers fitted with Quick Flashing Yellow Lights (Q.Y). Vessel operators shall reduce vessel speed so as to create no wash and to remain clear of the construction zone.

Works will be conducted using the following plant and equipment;

- Jack Up Barge 2, MSV2647 (18 x 22m), serviced by Pontoon L147, ID 857329 (55 x 17m)
- Jack Up Barge 3, ID 6966 (18 x 22m)
- Jack Up Barge 4, MSV 12764(18 x 22m)
- Tug MV Stay Calm (MSV 12389)(17 x 6m)
- Tug Lady Dashed (7.6 x 4.0m)
- Work Boat MV Mayas Bay (MSV 12253) (7.5 x 2.5m)
- MV Walrus, MSV 12920. (12m long)
- Tender vessel Phoenix, MSV 105514. (2m long)
- Tender vessel Workboat 020, MSV 114554.(2m long)
