INSPECTION AND STRENGTHENING WORKS FOR SERVICES PROTECTION  
BETWEEN YARRA RIVER BEACONS 33/34 AND 35/36- EXTENDED**

**Date:** 14 June 2022

**Refers:** NtM 182 (T) / 2022 and is hereby cancelled.

**Details:** Mariners are advised that inspection and strengthening works for the services protection between Yarra River beacons 33/34 and 35/36 is now extended until approximately 08 July 2022.

Works will be conducted around shipping and from the following boats:

*MV Pro Diver (Primary Dive Vessels) and MV Norgate*

Vessels operating within the vicinity of the works area shall reduce vessel speed so as to create no wash and pass the support vessel at a safe distance. The on water works supervisor in operational control of the works is contactable on 0409 666 272 or alternatively on 0417 100 624 or VHF Ch.12.

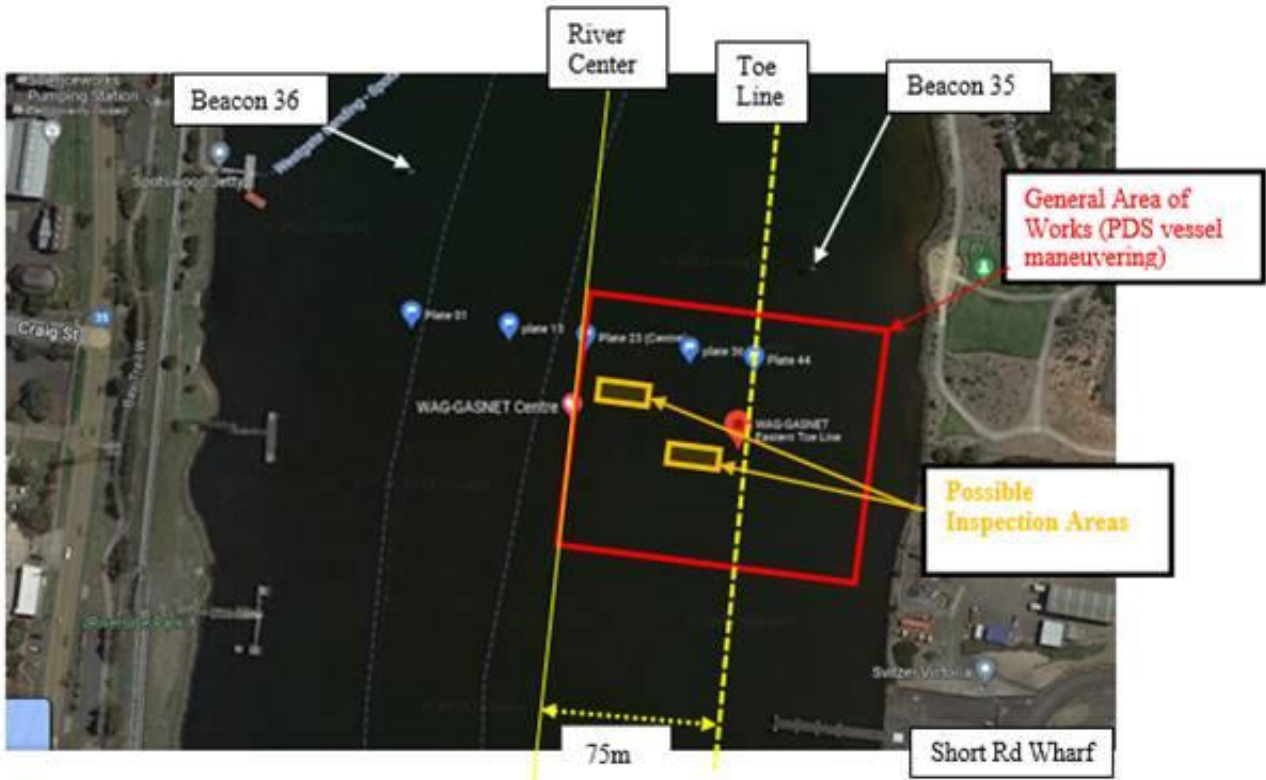
**Mariners are advised to navigate with additional caution and reduce speed so as to create no vessel wash when in the vicinity of the works at the services protection.**

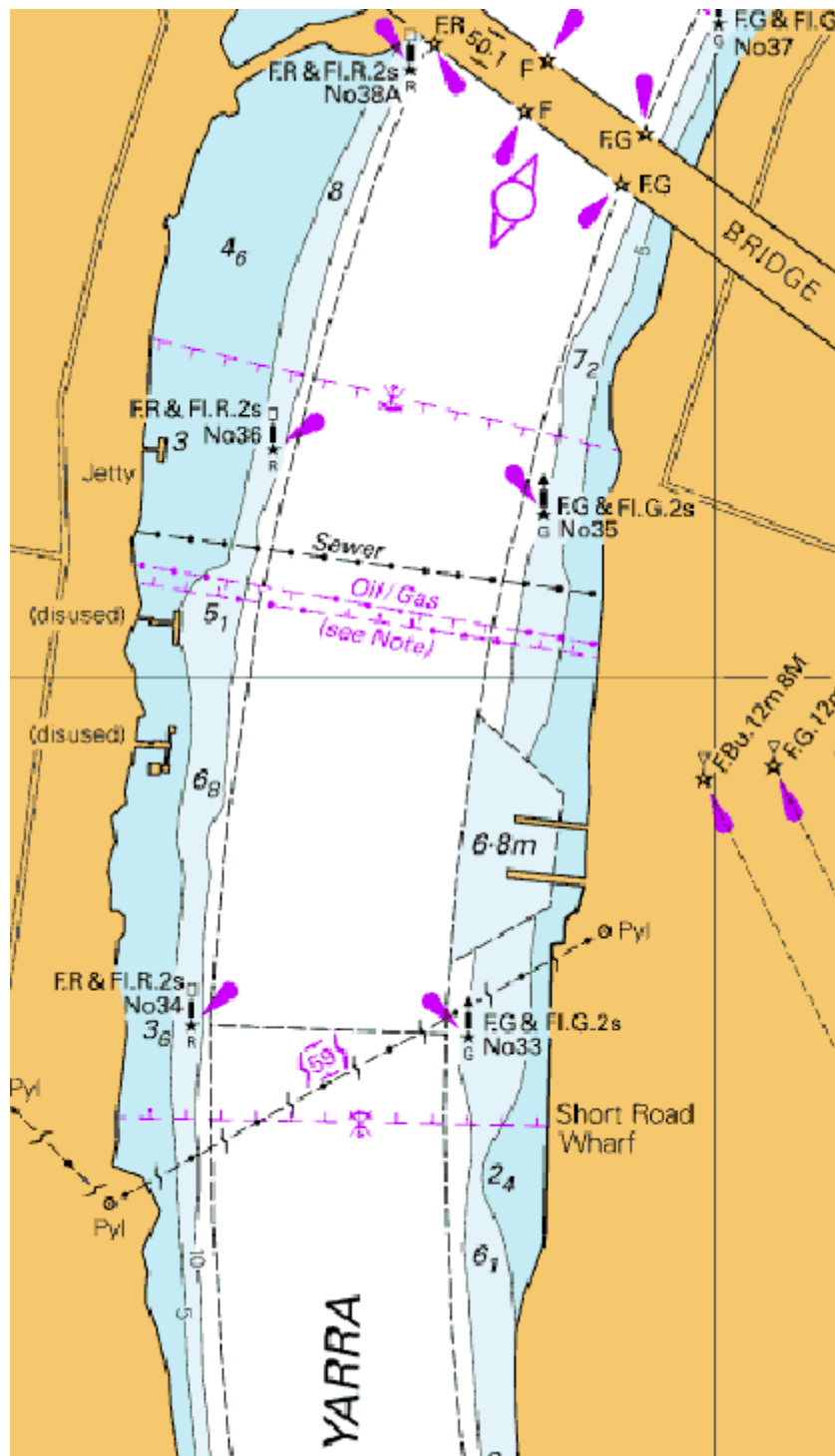
