**PORT OF MELBOURNE - YARRA RIVER
INSPECTION OF HOBSONS BAY MAIN SEWER PROTECTION PLATES
BETWEEN BEACONS 33/34 AND 35/36 - EXTENDED**

Date: 28 October 2022

Refers: NtM 314 (T)/2022 and is hereby cancelled

Details: Mariners are advised that the inspection of the Hobsons Bay Main Sewer protection plates, between Yarra River Beacons 33/34 and 35/36 is now extended until approximately **Wednesday 30 November 2022**.

The inspection works will involve diving and will take place around shipping, managed by Melbourne VTS.

Works will be conducted from the following vessels:

- MV Pro Diver and MV Venture

Vessels transiting the Yarra River in the vicinity of the services protection during diving operations, must reduce vessel speed so as to create no wash and pass the dive vessel at a safe distance.

The on-water works' supervisor is contactable on VHF Channel 12 or 0409 666 272.

Mariners are advised to navigate with caution and reduce vessel speed so as to create no vessel wash when in the vicinity of the works at the services protection.

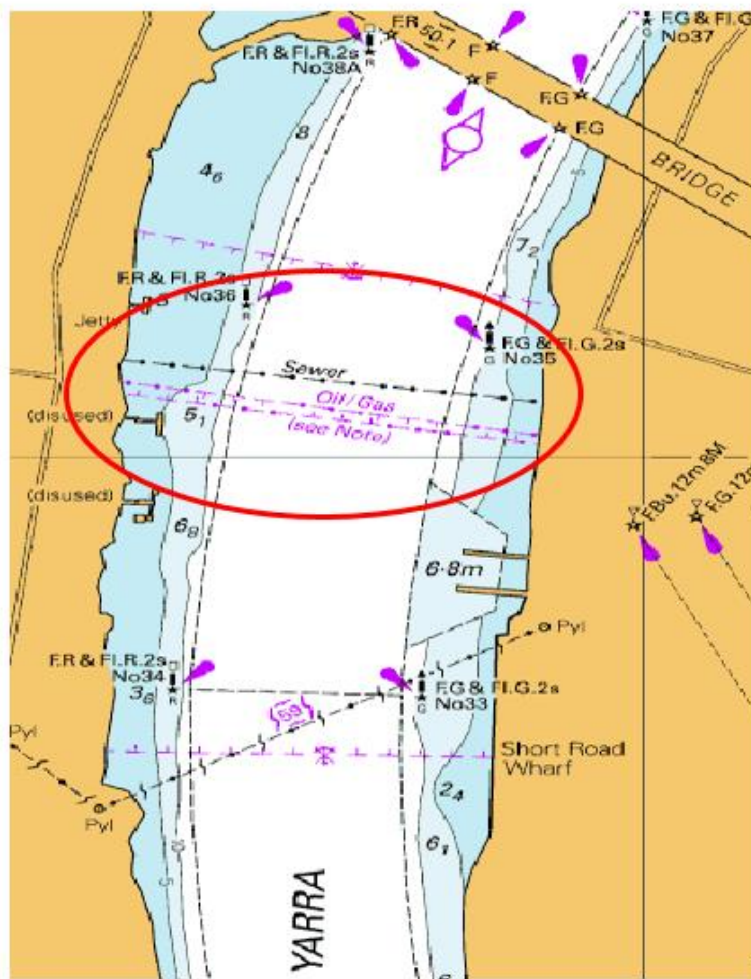
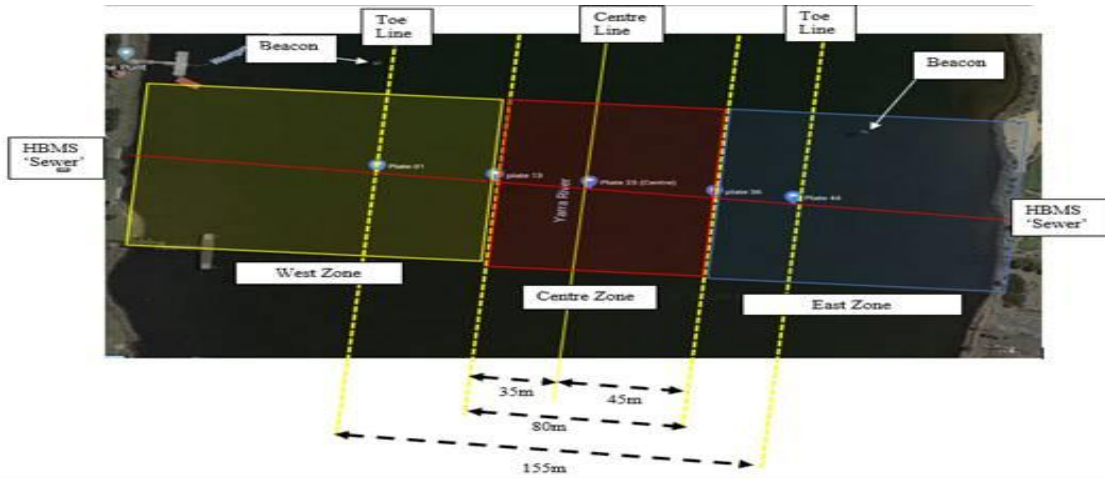
